## Department 1 Dairy

**Forms needed to show a dairy animal at the Grant County Fair**

[Junior Class Entry Form](#).

[Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet](#). Bring with you to the Fair.

All exhibitors who plan to stay overnight must register by completing the [Registration Form for an Overnight Pass](#).

**Forms needed to participate in the cheese sale at the livestock auction**

**Exhibitors will be selected at the Grant County Fair but if you would like to be considered for this selection make sure you have completed the forms below.**

[Dairy Registration Form](#) submitted to the Extension Office. (Typically the deadline is mid-May.)

## Department 3 Swine

### *Forms needed to show a pig at the Grant County Fair*

Identify your animal typically in late April. (Watch the 4-H ECHO for details.)

[Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet](#) Bring with you to the Fair.

(Swine exhibitors must be YCQA certified. See the 4-H ECHO for details to be certified.)

**YQCA Certificate (this needs to be turned into the fair office with your fair entry form. No YQCA certificates will be accepted after 4:00pm on July 27.)**

*All exhibitors who plan to stay overnight must register by completing the [Registration Form for an Overnight Pass](#).*

(You must also attend a Livestock Auction Seminar. See the 4-H ECHO for a list of those that have attended a seminar.)

## Department 5 Goats

All goat weathers must be weighed in at the Fairgrounds. (Typically in early May)

#### [Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet](#) Bring with you to the Fair.

Animals must be identified with an official scrapie ear tag if they are sexually intact or over 12 months of age.

All exhibitors who plan to stay overnight must register by completing the [Registration Form for an Overnight Pass](#).

## Department 7 Poultry

### **Forms needed to show poultry at the Grant County Fair**

#### [Junior Class Entry Form](#)

#### [Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet](#) (All birds must have a wing or leg band ID) Bring with you to the Fair.

Flock certification or negative test indicating the flock is pullorum-typhoid free. Bring with you to the Fair.

### **Forms needed to participate in the livestock auction**

#### [Junior Class Entry Form](#) (with animal listed in a market class)

#### [Consignment Sheet](#) (previously known as the Green Sheet)

Identify birds at the Fairgrounds. (Typically in July)

#### [Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet](#). Bring with you to the Fair.

A Copy of the Flock certification or negative test indicating the flock is pullorum-typhoid free. Bring with you to the Fair (the Fair will keep the copy.)

(You must also attend a Livestock Auction Seminar. See the 4-H ECHO for a list of those that have attended a seminar.)

## Department 8 Rabbits

*Forms needed to show a rabbit at the Grant County Fair*

[Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet](#) (Animal must have tattoo ID.) Bring with you to the Fair.

*Forms needed to participate in the livestock auction*

[Consignment Sheet](#) (previously known as the Green Sheet)

Identify rabbits at the Fairgrounds. (Animals can be identified once per year typically in July. Animals cannot be identified at regularly scheduled Happy Hopper meetings.)

(You must also attend a Livestock Auction Seminar. See the 4-H ECHO for a list of those that have attended a seminar.)

## Department 9 Dogs

*Forms needed to show a dog at the Grant County Fair*

Attendance at 50% or more of the practices.

Distemper and Rabies shot information. Handed in prior to practice.

Attendance at 1 practice.
